

## FLY FISHING



Local flies that work well & others custom to the Snowy Mountains region are pictured on the right, below these are other flies that are definately worth having in your selection.

**UW** = Unweighted

Best used for shallow & surface feeding

**BH** = Bead Head

Slow sinking, best used in slow water

**TBH** = Tungsten Bead Head Fast sinking, best used in fast water to get nymphs down deep.

### "MATCH THE HATCH"

Having the right fly makes all the difference depending on your location. Watch for surface insect life such as moths, mosquitos & midges particularly in warmer weather conditions. Select a fly that best replicates the size, colour & apperance of local insect life in & around the waters edge, for best results.

### **SKILL LEVEL & RIVER FLOW**

With possible high water levels & flow in rivers & streams in spring, due to snow melt, only wade up to your knees when your starting your fly fishing journey, as you gain more confidence you can choose to wade deeper if necessary. Make sure your feet are steady & you have good footing on the river bed before you cast.

### **CLOTHING**

Correct clothing for trout fishing is important so your not seen by the fish. Good colours are plain dark green & brown, so you blend in with the background flora. Here in the Snowy Mountains blue is a bad colour as march flies are attracted to it. They will bite through it, even thick jeans. A sensible hat & polaroid sunglasses is important to shade your eyes, making it easier to spot fish. It's better to layer your clothes so you can strip down when they day warms up. If you intend on wading, take a change of clothes in a waterproof bag, it's easy to fall in.

## DAVY KNOT

nvented by Davy Wotten, this is a very simple & strong knot that minimises wastage, after some practice you shouldn't need to trim the tag at all.

when using egg patterns & glow-bugs.

rigs during seasonal spawning times

The Surgeons knot is a very simple & reliable knot to tie. Used to tie main ine to leader or tippet & paternoster

SURGEON'S KNOT



LINE / LEADER

MAIN LINE

Feed line through the eye.

Overlap the working ends of the lines.



Place working end over the leader.


2 Make a loop holding both lines.



Wrap around the leader & through the loop that is made.

Pass both lines through the loop, pulling

the leader all the way through.



Wrap around the bottom line & back through the main loop.



keep tag end at 90° to the knot. Hold the tag, pull the leader & Trim the tag end if necessary.

Pull all four strands tight & trim tag ends.

4 Pass both line through again.

# **LEADER LOOP**

used to tie a loop in the end your knotless The Leader Loop aka "Perfection Loop" is leader to attach to your fly line, via a nandshake knot.



Make a loop in the thick end of the leader.




Make a second loop in front of the first.



Pass the thick end between the two loops.



Pull the second loop through the first.



Hold the main line & tag, pull tight while keeping the knot flat.

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
