Bait fishing & lure spinning are commonly used land based methods for catching trout in the Snowy Mountains. Bait fishing is only permitted in the lakes & some pondage areas while lure spinning is allowed in both lakes & rivers. Here at Lakeside Lures & Tackle we'll teach you these methods & how to effectively use your fishing tackle to increase your chances at catching trout.

AGE LIMIT

Younger children are encouraged to cast lures & learn the correct techniques & skills needed to fish effectively. We recommend age 7+ for casting lures & age 10+ learning how bait-fish & learn stream-craft for river fishing.

BEST TIMES

Early morning & evening are ideal fish feeding times, however they can come on the bite during the day. Depending on weather, first light & the following few hours is recommended.

BE PREPARED

Weather conditions can change quickly in the Snowy Mountains, it's recommended to bring a broad brim hat or cap, sunblock, rain jacket or jumper depending on the forecast.

CATCH GUARANTEE

Please be mindful that Snowy Trout are wild animals, we'll never predict how they'll behave on the day. Our average catch rate is one fish per hour, you can be lucky & catch more or in some cases catch nothing.

PARENT OR GUARDIAN SUPERVISION

For lessons where up to 4 children are participating only, please ensure a parent or guardian is present for the lesson duration for emergencies & point of contact if needed.

Toilets are at the Hatchery carpark entrance & BBQ facilities are located in the Hatchery grounds if you wish to explore the river. Hatchery Bay has toilet facilities & undercover tables.

DRAG SETTINGS

- Fish should feel minimal resistance
- Start ⅓ of line weight, e.g. 6lb line = 2lb drag

LURE RETRIEVAL

- Spinners: Slow Retrieve with occasional pause
- · Soft Plastics : Sink, Retrieve, Pause

STRIKE!

Pause your lure, see if the fish has another go

HOOK UP!

- Lift your rod tip slightly to set your hook
- Increase your drag to stop line being pulled off

FIGHT 'EM FAST

- Fight the trout fast & get it into your net quickly
- Move away from structure to stop snags

LANDING YOUR CATCH

- · Always use a net to land a trout out, not your rod
- · Make sure the trout is in clear water while in your net
- Make sure the gills & fins are free from the side of the net

HOOK REMOVAL

- Use 'Best Practice' when handling trout: refer info sheet
- If the trout is hooked & you can see it, use a disgorger quickly
- If you can't see the hook, cut the line as close as possible
- Get the trout back into the water as quick as possible

FISH RELEASE

- · Trout may be sluggish after a catch or a struggle
- · Hold the trout gently beneath the water & let it swim free

PACKUP

· Leave only footprints!
